Dr. Sarojini Nadimpally is a public health researcher and Scientist in Delhi, and a leading feminist bioethicist in India. Through the Delhi-based non-profit SAMA, which she co-founded in 1999, Sarojini has led several studies on public health, reproductive technologies and surrogacy, ethics in clinical trials, access to medicines especially for marginalised communities, right to health in India's conflict zones (specifically, Kashmir, Gujarat and Uttar Pradesh). She is the co-organiser of the forthcoming 14th World Congress on Bioethics to be held in India in 2018.
